Related resources

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Cochrane reviews

- There is insufficient evidence on selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs) for autism spectrum disorders; they may not be effective in children but seem to have small positive effects in adults [D].
- There is no evidence that single or multiple dose intravenous secretin is effective as a treatment for autism [D].
- Auditory integration therapy is probably not effective for autism [C].
- Risperidone may be beneficial in some features of autism but the evidence is very limited [C].
- There is insufficient evidence on benefits and harms of gluten and/or casein free diet for persons with autism [D].

Other evidence summaries

• Lovaas treatment seems not to help children with autism to achieve normal functioning [D].
